Last Call: Completing a United Mahaki Approach to the Settlement of the Mangatu forest claims

We need your support to set up the Mahaki Forest Settlement Trust to receive the Mangatu Crown forest land and compensation. We are seeking the mandate for Te Aitanga a Mahaki - including Te Whanau a Kai and Ngariki Kaiputahi (including Nga Uri o Tamanui).

Te Whanau a Kai Claimant Group – led by Dave Hawea - want Te Whanau a Kai descendants to support their Te Whanau a Kai Trust. Supporting that Trust means that you support Te Whanau a Kai getting 90% of the settlement for Mangatu forest (Mangatu 1 & 2 land) or \$180m (based on 100% compensation of \$191m). The rest of the hapu of Te Aitanga a Mahaki will only get 10% including those that actually have marae, urupa, land and homes by the Mangatu forest.

Nga Uri o Tamanui (the descendants of Rawiri Tamanui) – led by Owen Lloyd and others - are seeking 50% of the Mangatu forest. They were once claiming on behalf of all Ngariki Kaiputahi but have narrowed this down to just the descendants of Rawiri Tamanui. In 2017, less than 30 people attended their mandating hui. They will do better this time on the basis of 50% or \$100m.

In our proposal, Te Aitanga a Mahaki have agreed to Te Whanau a Kai and Ngariki Kaiputahi receiving their own allocation, and have enhanced the Waitangi Tribunal's suggested division in their 2004 Turanga report as follows: Ngariki Kaiputahi 8%; Te Whanau a Kai 20% and Te Aitanga a Mahaki 72%. Te Aitanga a Mahaki includes 7 hapu and 2 recognised claimant groups. At 100% compensation the cash will be **\$15m plus 8% of the land for Ngariki Kaiputahi** (the same cash as Ngai Tamanuhiri) and **\$41m for Te Whanau a Kai** (nearly twice the cash for Rongowhakaata).

This is the last call. We need you to vote for the Mahaki Forest Settlement Trust and then register and vote against the separate entities for Te Whanau a Kai Trust and Nga Uri o Tamanui Trust.

Attached to the back of this letter is your voting form. You can vote manually by filling it in and posting it back in the prepaid envelope. Or by using your unique voting code noted above to complete your voting on line through www.mahaki.com. It is easy and takes 5 minutes at most.

You can tick up to 3 boxes at the top of the voting form for: Te Aitanga a Mahaki, Te Whanau a Kai and/or Nga Uri o Tamanui. **We are asking you to then tick yes for all 6 questions that follow.** Then register with the other two trusts and vote against their mandate and approach.

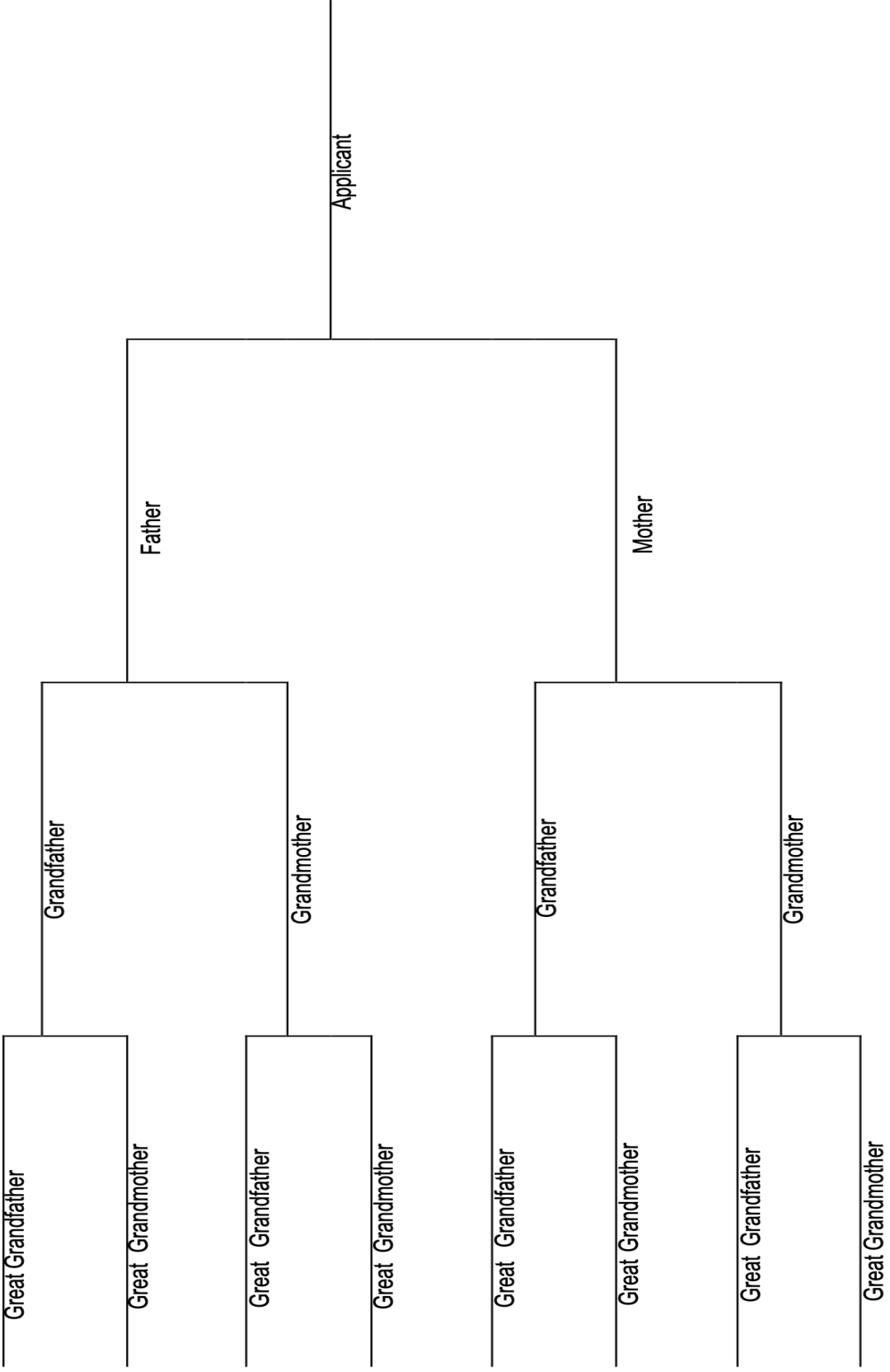
